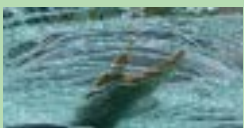




Dear Church Family,

As I shared in my sermon, a few weeks ago, a large wooden plank flew through the air on Route 80 and smashed into my windshield. Glass shattered everywhere. By God's grace, I wasn't injured—just shaken. At first, I was deeply grateful: "It's just a windshield. I'm okay." But as I drove home, my thoughts shifted to "what-ifs" and worries about my new car and rising insurance costs. Isn't it strange how quickly our hearts can shift from gratitude to grumbling? From recognizing grace to rehearsing regret?



After the impact, I found a small sharp fragment of glass remained stuck right in front of me, shaped like a peace sign. This was a re-

minder that even when life shatters around us, when gratitude turns to grumbling, when fear threatens to overwhelm grace, we are called to look for the fragment of peace God leaves right in front of us. *It may be small, but it's real.*

Gratitude makes us affirm that there are good things in the world, gifts and benefits we've received, and helps us acknowledge that they come from God.

This doesn't mean ignoring pain or suffering. Rather, gratitude encourages us to identify goodness in what we're experiencing and give God credit for it. Gratitude grants us the strength and resilience to see things from a God's perspective.

As we approach Thanksgiving, I want to remind you of the simple, lasting blessings in our lives: the people and moments that lift us up, nurture our faith, and give us strength. During this season, I invite you to reflect on and share the gifts of love, faith, and encouragement you have received and consider sharing them with others. We have many opportunities to show love and help our communities, local and global in this newsletter.

I encourage you to join us for our youth-led Thanksgiving service (Homecoming Sunday) on Nov 23 and our Advent worship series (beginning Sun, Nov 30), Advent study, and events as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. May we enter this season with gratitude, joy, and a renewed desire to share Christ's love

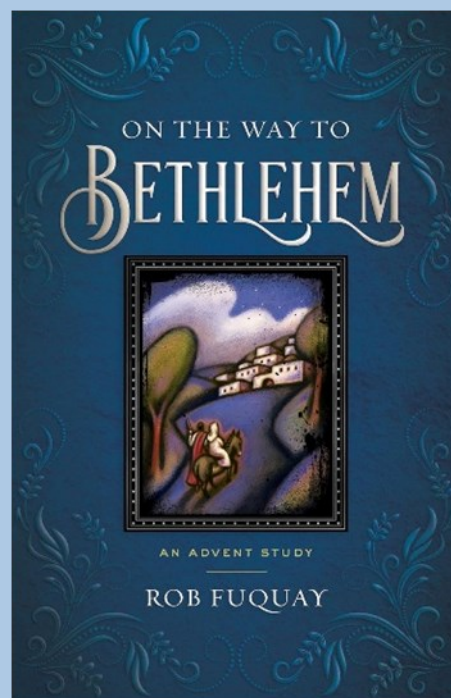
The Journey to Christmas begins in Rome

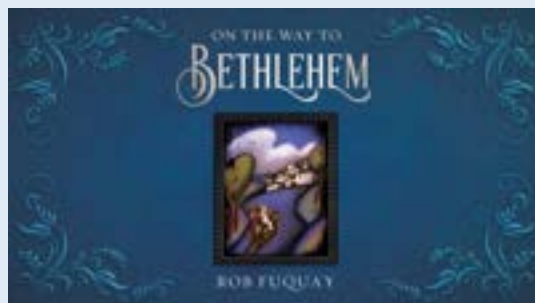

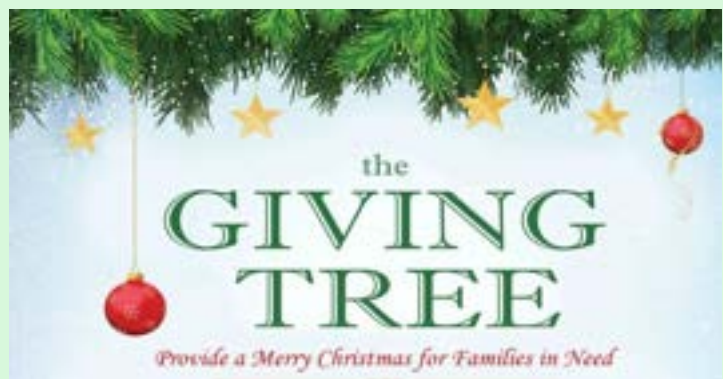

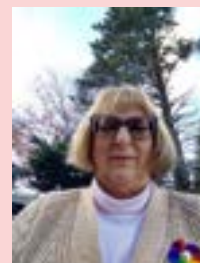
PB&J sandwiches are one of the top requested food items because they last for several days and do not need to be eaten immediately.



Lay Ministry Award from the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference

Congratulations to Melanie Newton & SUMC’s Congregational Care Ministry Team!

Each year, the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference recognizes one of the areas of ministry in local churches and grants an Award. This year’s theme was a care ministry, and Melanie Newton, a chairperson of Congregational Care Ministry (CCM) Team, and the team, were selected to receive the Lay Ministry Recognition Award from our Annual Conference.



Here are a few lines from the letter we received: **“Thank you for being a primary agent of God’s mission in today’s world... The ministry of the laity flows from a commitment to Christ’s outreaching love. Lay people are called to be active advocates of the gospel of Jesus Christ. The witness of the laity—their Christ-like examples of everyday living and the sharing of their own faith experiences—is the primary evangelistic ministry through which all people will come to know Christ.”**

Our CCM Team lives that calling in quiet, steady ways—sending cards, making phone calls, visiting those in need, and bringing Communion to our homebound members. This year alone (as of September 2025), as recorded by Melanie and the team, they have sent 223 cards, made 108 phone calls, and completed 56 visits (including home communion), which continually reminds our church family that they are loved and never forgotten. **We celebrate this recognition (not just human recognition) and, even more, the love of Christ made visible through their service and the name of God glorified.**

TRUSTEE UPDATE

The Trustees primary responsibilities is routine maintenance, overseeing major repairs and planning for future capital improvements.

The building upkeep was accomplished largely due to the volunteer efforts by Ron Chase and Bob Ruppel, along with other volunteers and contractors. It is an aging building so upkeep is continuous. We really appreciate the countless hours that Ron Case (not a trustee) and Bob Ruppel have spent here making those repairs, replacing broken items and refreshing the appearance of our building.

We were able to accomplish some much-needed work on the parsonage which has included but not limited to the staining of the deck as well as replacing the storm door in the rear entrance. We have also cut back the trees and bushes around the parsonage.

Some of our projects and repairs around the church are as follows. General weeding of the church, grounds and the landscape islands around our church and parking lot. The prayer garden has been attended to as well. New mulch and gravel has the prayer garden looking great.

Some of our projects this year in addition to those listed above:

- Cleaned carpets in three of the church offices and some common areas
- A/C unit replaced in the church office
- Filled potholes in the parking lot
- General gutter cleaning
- Installed radon detector in the thrift shop
- Repaired handicap parking sign

Our future projects will include:

- Improving our church security system by applying for a grant
- Increase handicap parking by adding two additional spaces
- Replace filters in the central air conditioning unit.
- Removal of the old boy scout shed
- Purchase of a defibrillator

I feel very fortunate and blessed for the support of all our church family. Without your generous contributions to the building fund, none of this work would be possible. All building fund contributions go directly to the planned project and future repairs that are needed.
