News from the United Methodist Church

Updates on Votes from Annual Conferences

The Council of Bishops of The United Methodist Church has completed canvassing the votes of annual conferences on the four constitutional amendments that were approved by the 2024 General Conference.

Amendments

	Yes Votes	No Votes	Percentage
Amendment I	34,148	3,124	91.60%
Amendment II	33,895	2,920	92.00%
Amendment III	33,875	2,989	91.90%
Amendment IV	33,952	2,792	92.40%



By The Book of Discipline (BOD) any proposed constitutional amendments require ratification by annual conferences. The results are canvassed, certified and announced by the Council of Bishops. The four proposed constitutional amendments are as follows:

1. Regionalization

A set of amendments to create new regional conferences that will each have equal power to adapt portions of the BOD within their respective regions.

2. Inclusiveness of the Church

An amendment to add the words “gender” and “ability” to Paragraph 4, Article 4 of The UMC Constitution to categories that cannot be used to exclude membership in The United Methodist Church.

3. Racial Justice

An amendment to strengthen Article V of The UMC Constitution by explicitly recognizing the church’s role in combating racism, racial inequity, colonialism, white privilege, and white supremacy.

4. Educational Requirements for Clergy

General Conference voted to amend Section VI, Article IV of The United Methodist Church Constitution, which establishes the educational requirements for clergy members of annual or provisional conferences who are eligible to vote for clergy delegates to the General Conference.

Regarding the shooting in Minneapolis

In a pastoral letter to the Dakotas-Minnesota Episcopal Area following the shooting of a woman by federal agents, Bishop Lanette Plambeck calls congregations to be places of refuge and prayer. She urges United Methodists to be attentive in grief, to listen to those who are afraid, and to remain open to voices that challenge our assumptions.

“In this fragile space between tragedy and truth, may we be a people who lament honestly, seek justice humbly, and refuse the lie that violence has the final word,” writes Bishop Plambeck.

She concludes the letter with a prayer:

*God of mercy and nearness,
we come to you with heavy hearts.*

We grieve a life lost and hold close all who mourn.

*Be near to those whose hearts are broken,
to those who are afraid,
and to all who are waiting for truth to come into the light.*

*In this tender space between tragedy and understanding,
teach us to lament honestly,
to seek justice with humility,
and to walk gently with one another.*

*Guard us from haste, from hardened hearts,
and from the temptation to let fear or violence shape our way.*

We place our hope in you, O God of resurrection.

*When death and grief seem to have the final word,
remind us that life and love endure.*

*Make us instruments of your peace,
and keep us faithful in the days ahead.*

*We offer this prayer in the name of Jesus,
who brings life out of death
and hope out of sorrow.*

Amen!





Lenten Series 2026 & Sermon Series




Join us for our Lenten Worship & Sermon Series beginning Feb 22



Christmas Caroling



Christian Outreach Project 2026





Round Table Conversation Resumes








