



Dear Church Family,

Recently, I sat down to watch a movie I had already seen before. I knew exactly how it would end, and that knowledge changed the way I watched the whole film. Every difficult scene, every moment of tension and heart-break, I could endure with a kind of peace, because I already knew how the story would turn out.

Lent is like that.

We are in the middle of the 40-day journey of Lent, which will lead us to Jesus' crucifixion and the joy and wonder of his resurrection. We already know the end of this journey, and keeping the end in mind shapes the way we live out this season. No matter what we are going through today, the resurrection of Christ confirms that comfort is on the way. Our pain and despair will not last forever, our grief will be lifted from our shoulders, our Good Friday will pass, and we will find healing, wholeness, and hope in the resurrecting and transforming power of God's love. We really have to trust that.

During this season of Lent, God invites us to slow down and turn our hearts again toward our Lord, Jesus Christ. In the busyness of life, it is easy for faith to become something we assume rather than something we actively nurture. Lent gives us a chance to rediscover the practices that help root our lives more deeply in God's grace.

This Lent, we are reading the Gospel of Matthew together (one chapter a day) so that we may walk more closely with Jesus and listen again to his words, his teachings, and his call to discipleship. Prayer is another way we open ourselves to God's presence. Each Thursday from 4:30–6:00 pm the church will be open for quiet prayer. In a world filled with noise, chaos, and urgency, this is an opportunity to pause, breathe, and bring before God the concerns of our lives and the needs of others.

Our journey also continues together in worship and study. On Wednesdays at 6:00 pm we share Soup Suppers and conversation as part of our "Unlikely Lent" study, exploring how God often meets us in surprising places and unexpected people. As we move toward Holy Week and Easter, we will remember the depth of Christ's love and the hope of the resurrection through several meaningful gatherings. From Palm Sunday through Easter morning, we will walk together through the story that stands at the center of our faith, the story of Jesus' sacrifice, love, and victory over death.


My hope is that this Lenten season will not simply be another series of church events, but a time when we intentionally draw closer to God and to one another. I hope you will join us as we walk this journey together.


THURSDAY PRAYERS DURING LENT





Christian Outreach Project 2026









SUMC Board of Trustee Update

The Trustees' primary responsibilities continue to be routine maintenance, overseeing major repairs and planning for future improvements.

The building maintenance is still being done by volunteers and contractors. Some of our key volunteers include but are not limited to Ron Case, Bob Ruppel and Roger Hendrickson. Building upkeep does not get a break, even in the winter months. Volunteer efforts help widen walkways, salt icy walkways and even shovel snow when needed. We have also replaced lights, fixed closet doors and done several other minor repairs around the church. Our goal as Trustee members is to assure the congregation sees a well-maintained building all year round.

We were able to accomplish so much over the past few months to keep everyone comfortable and safe. We have purchased new batteries for our AED, we have maintained our heating and cooling system and had several safety walkthroughs.

Some of our projects around the church are as follows. We have a new snow removal service and have had several meetings to review our expectations regarding snow removal with them. The new snow removal service has given us a more budget friendly option for our snow removal. We have also expanded our handicap parking by one spot. This will allow an additional spot for our church members that need to park closer to the church. We have received positive feedback for this effort and plan to add another handicap spot soon.

Our future projects will include:

- Painting the entrance to the Thrift Shop
- Increase handicap parking by adding one additional space
- Replace filters on the central air conditioning unit
- Purchase another defibrillator battery
