




OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL IS LOOKING FOR HELP!



MISSIONS UPDATE

There are so many things to be thankful for, especially during the last few months of 2023!

Thrift Shop Miracle Workers – While we are always grateful for the work that our Thrift Shop volunteers provide for our community outreach, their work in 2023 also contributed over \$30,000 to our church's general fund, which was over \$8000 than the budget estimate. This was one of the largest contributors to helping us reduce our 2023 budget gap between our expected donations versus expenses. We are so grateful for their weekly dedication to managing and selling a lot of donations from the community that support so many local families. FINANCE UPDATE

Q3 2023 Finance Committee Update

I hope everyone is staying dry during what has been a wet start to Winter, as discussed, the Finance Committee is committed to maintaining open communication and transparency. With that in mind, I would like to share the current state of SUMC.

We have always had an extremely generous congregation that is spiritually, and financially, committed to the wellbeing of our church, as evidenced by contributions continuing to surpass targets through September 2023. Contributions continued to exceed the ministry plan by over 12% and we have managed to keep expenses in check, only 10K over the original budget in a time of high inflation and increasing costs!

As mentioned in our prior distribution, our original 2023 Ministry plan included a negative Net Plan position, primarily driven by the ministry initiatives placed into service over the last couple years. These exciting initiatives are long-term investments intended to grow and expand on our ministry commitments and offerings.

We continue to ask our flock to keep their ears and eyes open to opportunities for our congregation to get out into the community at new and exciting events to engage, show our support, and remind everyone that our doors are always open!

I want to thank everyone for their continued support of our beloved SUMC and ask you to keep sharing your gifts with our family as we continue our journey building toward our future!


PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY


MEN'S STUDY—Saturdays, 7:00 am to 9:00 am via Zoom
